Transitioning towards a globally competitive, low-carbon knowledge-based economy is a key strategic goal for the EU. As public finances get tighter, every Euro needs to be invested carefully to achieve the greatest impact.

Public officials have a role to play but in these economically uncertain times, it isn't just what you do, but how you do it that is important. Officials need the capacity to innovate, to make effective use of existing know-how and of new technologies. Structural Funds, if used effectively, can be levers of change. The '*enhancing institutional capacity*' funding theme is designed to build the human capital of regional administrations and their ability meet these challenges. Eligible activities for this funding theme include:

- ⤴ mechanisms to improve good policy and programme design, monitoring and evaluation, including through studies;
- ⤴ statistics and expert advice, support for interdepartmental coordination and dialogue between relevant public and private bodies;
- ⤴ capacity building in the delivery of policies and programmes in the relevant fields, including with regard to the enforcement of legislation, especially through continuous managerial and staff training and specific support to key services, inspectorates and socio-economic actors including social and environmental partners, relevant non-governmental organisations and representative professional organisations.

This workshop will focus on what regional officials can do to improve their effectiveness, use the power of data analysis to reveal opportunities for efficiency and innovative approaches to inter-sectoral cooperation.

It will outline new ways to get different departments and their valuable information out of their silos and collaborating so that Structural Fund programming is integrated and comprehensive.
